A brief explanation of the clay process.

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
3 MAJOR TYPES OF CLAY

- Clay that is fired at a **low** temperature.
 - Ex: Red Art, Raku



EARTHENWARE

- Clay that is fired at a **high** temperature.
 - Ex: Buff, Black



STONEWARE

- The most **fragile** of clays.
 - Delicate and pure white. Very challenging.



PORCELAIN

5 MAIN CERAMIC SKILLS

• Clay is formed with your **hands** and nothing else.





 Clay is rolled into "snakelike" pieces and slipped and scored together.





• Clay is flattened into **sheets** using a rolling pin or slab rolling machine.





 Using a pottery wheel to manipulate clay in an organized way.



THROWING



• Usually created using **plaster**. Allows for multiple reproductions.





3 STAGES OF DRYING CLAY

• Clay is flexible and can be easily worked with.





 Clay can only be carved at this stage. Not too wet, and not too dry.



LEATHER HARD


• Clay's **final** stage of drying. It must be bone dry to go into the kiln.



BONE DRY

3 STAGES OF CERAMIC WARE

• "Ware" is a fancy word for "Pottery."



• Clay is still wet, but **unfired** at this stage.



GREENWARE

• Clay has been fired once, and is usually a light pink color.



BISQUEWARE

 Clay has been fired twice, and is a finished product at full strength.



GLAZEWARE

COMMON CERAMIC VOCABULARY

• Clay in **liquid** form. Used for slipping and scoring, along with decoration.





• Liquid that undergoes a chemical reaction during firing and creates a **glassy** finish.





• A paint-like liquid that goes onto a clay body before glaze.



UNDERGLAZE

• Small sand/rock particles in clay that strengthen a clay body.



GROG

• A large oven made of **soft-brick** that hardens the clay or conditions the glaze.










CERAMICS CLUB RAKU TRIP

• Kneading the clay into a cone shape to eliminate air bubbles.



WEDGING

• Making marks with a toothed rib on two pieces of clay you wish to **attach**.



SCORING

 Added to scored pieces of clay in order for them to bond together.
