- Every color must have a value scale and must appear three-dimensional. (This is the key to great drawings!)
- Use a weird-sounding word. Be original and use your personality! DO NOT VIOLATE COPYRIGHT!

Guiding Question – What does a light source do for your drawings?

You Will Learn:

- Student will experiment with oil pastels and blending colors to make three dimensional forms.
- Student will explore their world through symbolism to balance their own imagery and text.
- Student will research contemporary graffiti art as inspiration to their own artwork.
